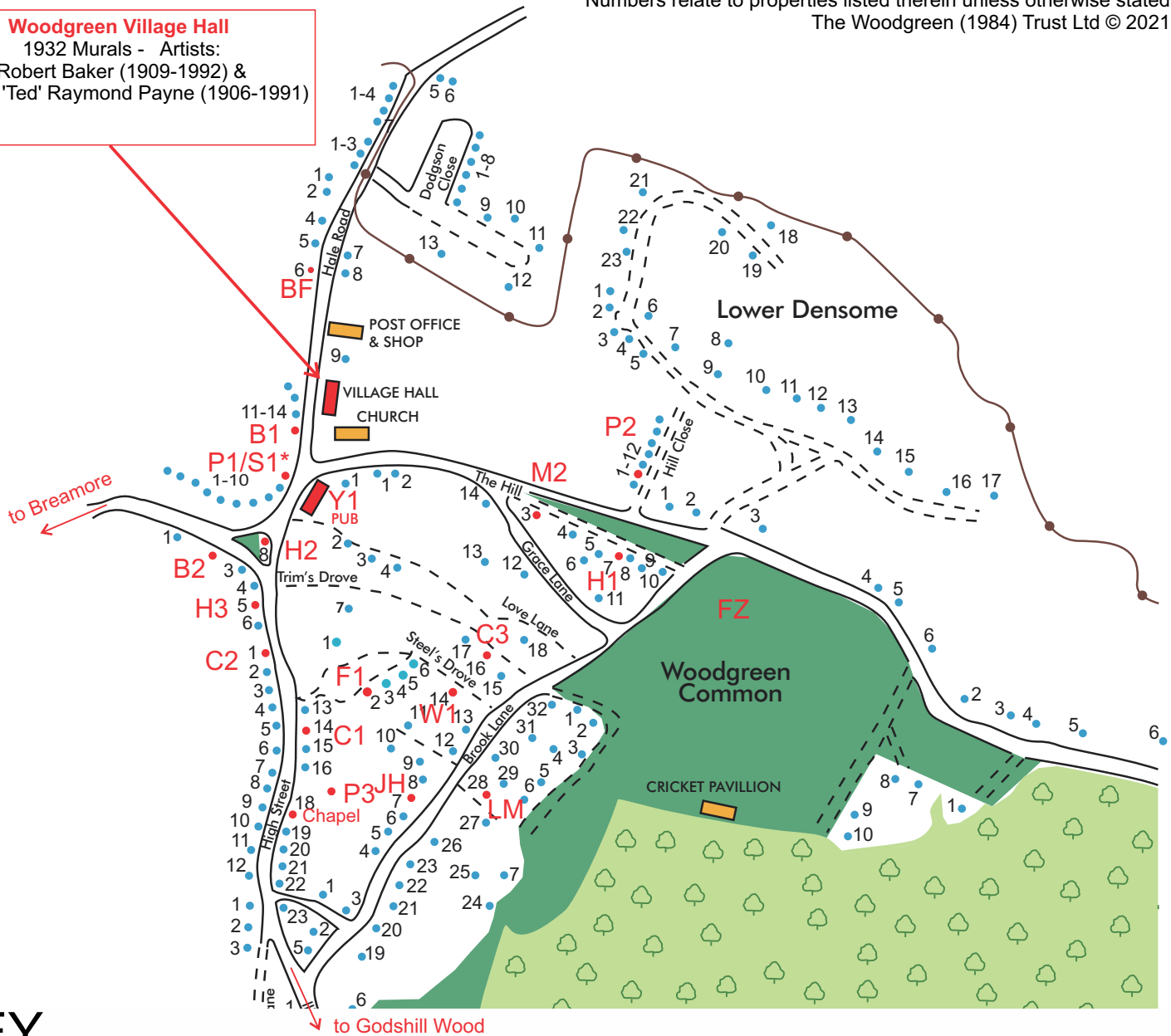

- H1** Mrs Hilda (nee Harrington) Biddlecombe & mother, Mrs Elsie Harrington (former semi-detached houses, now combined)

- P1/S1** Ernest 'Ern' Parker - (about 1966, a pair of cottages & various dilapidated farm buildings between no's 2 & 3 St. George's Cottages were demolished; 'Ern' had occupied the one closest to St. Boniface Church & was rehoused in the newly built Hall House. On the cleared land, Local Authority properties were built, numbered 3 to 10; the original no. 3, occupied by Douglas Brewer & family since 1964, was renumbered '11').

- P3** John Philpott & mother, Mrs Alice Philpott
- S1*** Joby Sivier
- W1** Miss Daisy Walker
- Y1** Ross Young - (Landlord, 'Horse & Groom' Public House)

Alfred Brewer - (at 'Edric', Station Road, Fordingbridge)
Mrs Kitty (nee Smith) Barter - (along 'The Shallows', by Mill Bridge, Breamore)
Arthur Vincent - (property in Godshill Wood)

- JH** Jack Hooper - 'poacher'
- LM** Laurie Marks - 'poacher'
- BF** Alfred Witt - 'milking cow' at 'Barn's Farm' BF
